Entry Procedure

Entry forms are to be completed and handed in, with the entry fee, during the week preceding the show to Kay Richardson, 72 Rosamund Road. or Bill Clarke at 44 Home Close, by midday 18th Sept.. **For the autumn show only**, we have the Village Hall available on Saturday evening, 18th Sept. You will be able to bring your exhibits in to display from 7.30-8.30 pm (not children's).

.Many thanks in anticipation of your co-operation. You may request and send back your entry form via email to purplepouting.fish06@yahoo.co.uk. However, email is not infallible, so please ensure that you have received a confirmation reply from Kay.

Under no exceptions will new entries be accepted on the morning of the show

Children's entry forms are acceptable on the day, however as we are having more entries it is really helpful to have them before hand.

Exhibits should be brought to the Village Hall between

9.00 and 10.00 am on the morning of the Show.

Exhibitors need to be out of the hall by 10.15 at the latest to enable judging to commence.

Public admitted at 2.00 pm.

Children's trophies will be presented at 3.30 pm and they will then receive their prize money. The main trophy presentation will be at 4 pm.

Would exhibitors refrain from removing their exhibits until 15 minutes after the trophy presentations.

In the following classes, where more than one specimen is requested, uniformity is what we are looking for i.e., alike in size, form and colour.
