**Entry Procedure**

Entry forms are to be completed and handed in, with the entry fee during the week preceding the show and preferably by 7.00 pm. on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March to Kay Richardson, 72 Rosamund Road, and by the absolute latest to Kay Richardson by midday on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> March. You may request and send back your entry form via email to **purplepouting.fish06@yahoo.co.uk**. However, email is not infallible, so please ensure that you have received a confirmation reply from Kay.

**Under no exceptions will new entries be accepted on the morning of the show.**

Children's entry forms are acceptable on the day, however as we are having more entries it is really helpful to have them beforehand.

Exhibits should be brought to the Village Hall between  
**9.00 and 10.00 a.m.** on the morning of the Show.

Exhibitors need to be out of the hall by 10.15 at the latest to enable judging to commence.

Public admitted at 2.00 p.m.

Children's trophies will be presented at 3.30 pm and they will then receive their prize money. The main trophy presentation will be at 4 pm.

Would exhibitors refrain from removing their exhibits  
until 15 minutes after the trophy presentations.

**In the following classes, where more than one specimen is requested, uniformity is what we are looking for i.e., alike in size, form and colour.**

**Hint:** Exhibits should be fresh, clean, free from blemish and any damage. **Flowers:** Make sure that they are firm in the vase and taking up water. **Vegetables:** Be careful when lifting from the garden With parsnips, carrots etc., try not to break off that fine long tail. Parsnips, carrots, beans, beetroot etc. are usually just laid out on the show table, but potatoes, tomatoes, shallots, peppers etc. are best placed on a plate, a paper one will do. Shallots look better mounted on dry sand and onions on a ring. Better to leave clean roots on cabbages and lettuces, they will keep fresh longer. All varieties of beans and peas should be displayed with stalks attached. Fruits and berries should have stalks intact and should not be polished.

- 18 1 vase, 5 blooms, any colour, spring flowers, excluding classes 14-1
- 19 Blossom, 3 sprays, white, any one variety
- 20 Blossom, 3 sprays, any other colour, any one variety
- 21 1 vase, 3 stems of Hellebore, mixed or one variety

**POT PLANTS**

For outstanding exhibit in classes 22-26

Please pay particular attention to size restrictions,  
as this just might be the deciding factor for the judge.

- 22 Pot plant, or spring bulbs in flower, pot not to exceed 15 cm in diameter
- 23 Pot plant, foliage only, pot not to exceed 15 cm in diameter
- 24 Orchid, 1 pot, any variety
- 25 Bonsai, 1 pot
- 26 Pot plant, other

**FLORAL ART**  
**CORONATION CHALLENGE CUP**  
**Presented by Mr Fluxton in 1953**

For outstanding exhibit in classes 27-33

N.B. Materials used in the Floral Arts classes need not have been grown by exhibitors. Please pay particular attention to size restrictions for the material often relaxes in transit. The Judge/s will use a ruler as a deciding factor in awarding First, Second or Third place. Containers, baskets, trays etc used for display will be at the exhibitors' discretion, unless otherwise stated.

- 27 Arrangement of yellow flowers and foliage, not exceeding 45 cm wide in any direction
- 28 Arrangement of orange flowers and foliage, not exceeding 45 cm wide in any direction
- 29 Arrangement of either blue/purple/lilac, or combination of flowers and foliage, not exceeding 45 cm wide in any direction
- 30 Arrangement of foliage only, not exceeding 60cm wide in any direction
- 31 Table Centre: 'Easter Celebrations', not exceeding 30 cm by 30 cm in any direction
- 31 Petite arrangement of spring flowers and foliage, not exceeding 25 cm wide in any direction
- 33 Hanging basket as small or large as you like, providing you can display it on a table
