**Entry Procedure**

Entry forms are to be completed and handed in, with the entry fee, during the week preceding the show to Barbara Neville, 12 Mere Road, tel: 01865 316737, and by midday on the 17th September at the latest.

You may request and send back your entry form via e-mail to [bee@benjon.co.uk](mailto:bee@benjon.co.uk). However, e-mail is not infallible, so please ensure that you have received a confirmation reply from Barbara.

**No new adult entries be accepted on the morning of the show**

However, in exceptional circumstances children's entry forms can be submitted on the day of the show no later than 9.30a.m. although it is more helpful to have them the day before.

Exhibits should be brought to the Village Hall **between 9.00a.m. and 10.00a.m.** on the morning of the Show.

Exhibitors need to be out of the hall by 10.15a.m. at the latest to enable judging to commence.

Public are admitted at 2.00p.m.

Children's trophies will be presented at 3.30p.m. and they will then receive their prize money.  
The main trophy presentation will be at 4 pm.

We request that exhibitors refrain from removing their exhibits until 15 minutes after the final trophy presentation.

**Special Awards Regulations**

**YVONNE PARSLEY CUP**

Awarded by her to WHS and dedicated to her in 2002.

**FRED PARGETER CUP (children's classes)**

Donated by Sheila Pargeter in 2006, in memory of her late husband, Fred Pargeter.

Awarded to the Exhibitor of the Year – defined as the person who has produced the most successful range of exhibits over all WHS Shows during the current year. This shall be determined from the records kept by the Show Secretary, using the following points system:

| A Third Place Certificate  | 1 point  |

The winner will retain the cup until the Autumn Show of the following year and may have the plinth engraved, at his/her expense, if desired.

**THE BANKSIAN MEDAL**
